AUDIO DESCRIPTION

We encourage you to create an audio description of your work, so that everyone can enjoy it.

What is an audio description?

An audio description is a spoken version summarising the key visual points of your artwork, image or video, for those who are blind or visually-impaired.

Here is an example:



Perry is the official mascot of the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games. He is a 3D cartoon character whose body is a mix between a human and a bull. His head is a smiling bull, and he has arms, legs, and hands, standing tall like a human. He has fur around his wrists and ankles. He has a tail and large hooves for feet. He has multi-coloured patterns all over his skin, he is wearing a gold medal around his neck on a ribbon, and he is wearing a white sports outfit with the United by 2022 Legacy Charity logo.

How can I make an audio description?

1. Write down your audio description of your work, so that you can read it when you record. Write in the present tense. Use simple language with the main details of your art.
2. Choose a recording device and app e.g. 'Voice Memos' on iOS, or 'Voice Recorder' on Android.
3. Find a quiet location and speak directly into the microphone as you record your description.
4. Listen back to your recording to make sure it is clear.
5. Name the file 'insert artwork title_AUDIO' and include it with your submission.
